# DIRECTOR OF INITIATION PROGRAMS JASON HERD

Breakdown of our numbers for the 2022-2023 were as follows:

30 Chips 78 U6/7 – 15 were 2017 born and 63 were 2016 born. 55 U8

Total in IP was 163

#### Breakdown of our numbers for the 2023-2024 were as follows:

40 Chips

42 U6/7 – 32 were 2017 born and 10 were 2018 born.

46 U8 - Roughly 28 players were lost to Bombers and other leagues.

#### Total in IP 128 – Down 35



#### Anticipated numbers for the 2024-2025 are as follows:

**40 Chips** – A much better communication strategy is in place in effort to draw attention to the AMHL. Other efforts, such as the parade and attending schools will also impact these numbers in a positive way. Families have been turning to CanSkate, AGHA and other programs in Hamilton because they were not aware of the AMHL. I believe this will be different this season and this number may increase as a result.

**50 U6/7** – Given the success of the chips program last season, many kids will move up from chips to U6/7. With better communication this year, I suspect we may garner additional interest. This will also require a good communication plan early.

**40 U8** – I suspect this is going to be a tough reason for the U8 cohort. There are only 32 - 2017s coming up and many will be trying out for the bombers U8 MD program. We may need to look at interlocking with another organization in order make U8 viable this season.

#### <u>Chips</u>

For the first time, CHIPS ran 2x a week, and a bit later in the morning. I heard nothing but great things from families and trainers who participated. We will continue this through the 2024-2025 season.



## DIRECTOR OF JUNIOR HOUSE LEAGUE BRIAN VIVIEROS

### 2023/24 Season Recap

•A successful season in all age groups:

- •U9 ran 4 teams of 11 players
- •U11 ran 4 teams of 15 or 16 players
- •U13 ran 4 teams of 16 players



•U13 championship ended with a shootout.

### Look ahead for 2024/25

•We need to get a Jr. HL Director in place soon to ensure a smooth transition.

•Suggest that the new Jr. HL Director, and Development Director collaborate on a strategy for recruiting/converting goalies as they enter the critical U11 age group.

•There are discussions to potentially start house league programming with one or two weekends of skills and scrimmages before starting evaluations. This could potentially solve many of the recurring challenges with running evaluations in September, but still allows available kids to be on the ice.

•Many players from U11 and U13 Select teams have moved on to rep hockey for the coming season. This may have an impact on our numbers and available goalies for next season so we will need to monitor the registration numbers closely.





## DIRECTOR OF SENIOR HOUSE LEAGUE STEVE KALAMPALIKIS

The 2023-24 AMHL Sr. House League season was generally a successful one although there were a few issues that needed to be addressed.

### U15



U15 Division – creation of the U15BB team comprised of Ancaster players took away Several players in the division

4 teams with 12-13 players each

U15 Saints, led by Bruce Doidge went to City Championship Final

U14 Select team undefeated, led by Brian Vivieros

### U18

6 teams of 16-17 players per team Highly competitive season

### **Challenge:**

Goalies in U18, 7 goalies, but despite this added goalie, several absences due to work, additional sport commitments

### Solutions:

Goalies registration fee based on their participation rate (lower fee for higher participation)

Encourage next Senior HL Director to create a Whats App group of parents and goalies to help with fill in opportunities.

### U21



Division did not form this year due to lack of participation 11 participants registered

Has been re evaluated for 2024-2025 season and AMHL will attempt this program in the fall

Tim Horton's jerseys need to be ordered in July 2024 for the 2024-2025 season


House League jerseys need to be ordered based on estimated count for teams and players


